## B BLOCK JANAKPURI BRANCH



**Help the Needy:** A poor lady (name withheld on request) has requested that her son (a class VII student) is suffering from Hemophilia – a bleeding disorder – in which there can be INTERNAL bleeding anywhere in the body particularly in the joints and is difficult to stop. This gives severe pain to the child. For the treatment whenever required, she has to rush to JPN Hospital. That is the only Government hospital where this treatment is available.

They administer an injection. Sometime it requires even 2 or even 3 injections to stop bleeding. The injections are normally provided free by the hospital. But when it is not available in stock she has to purchase it from the market. It costs Rs. 5000/- each.

The disease is incurable.

We visited her home a couple of times. The financial condition of the lady is very bad. She has 2 grown up daughters and this son. Her husband is a small time tailor to whom we donated a sewing machine recently. Even complete school uniform – sweater, coat, shirt and socks, etc. have been donated to the child.

To look after the child the lady has taken loans from the financiers, neighbours and others who charge heavy interest – as much as 84% p.a. Though the total amount is about 75,000/- she is not even able to pay the interest thereon. The amounts vary from Rs. 1500/- to Rs. 32,000/-.

A few sympathizers met her and decided that we should make efforts to defray her loans, specially the smaller amounts. A campaign was therefore started and an amount of Rs. 53,600/- has been collected and paid to her to pay up her loans.

The lady has also been placed in a job in a Member's home for cooking. Efforts are also being made to get her some institutional help.

### Tricycle donated:

A tricycle was donated to Sh. Rakesh Kumar whose leg was crushed while at work, on 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2016.



### Distribution of Blankets:

21 blankets were distributed among poorest of the poor students of Ashirwad NGO on 6<sup>th</sup> January, 2017. The recipients were invited to Shri Sanatan Dharm Mandir, BA/BD Block and handed over the blankets by Smt. Vimla Arora (the donor) and some officials of the Branch.



### Blankets & Clothes For Hindus Displaced From Pakistan:

72 Blankets and a lot of clothes – woollen as well as cotton – particularly for ladies, were handed over to Shri Mahavir Prasad ji of Vishav Hindu Parishad for those who have migrated from Pakistan. These families have been rehabilitated in Rohini and Majnu ka Teela camps. There was a fire in their Jhuggi cluster at Majnu ka Teela in which 30 jhuggis were reduced to ashes. The inhabitants were rendered homeless in this biting cold. Our Branch made this small contribution for them.
