FROM THE NATIONAL SECRETARY GENERAL AN OVERVIEW

It is my privilege to present the Annual Report of Bharat Vikas Parishad in its Golden Jubilee year (2012-13). We had a successful year of service to the Nation through our work. The main highlights of the work during the year were as under:

- Parishad celebrated 150th Birth Anniversary of Swami Vivekanand by organizing various programmes including National level Elocution and Essay Writing Competitions.
- Zonal Conferences were held at nine locations to cover all the zones which were well organised and attended.
- Meetings of the national bodies and workshops in respect of various faculties were organised during the year.
- All India level programmes of our projects – NGSC, NSGSC, BKJ, etc. were successfully held.
- Branches and Prants continued to organize various sanskar, sewa and sampark projects throughout the country.
- During the year, Membership (families) rose by 5.33% to 52,799.
- Number of Vikas Ratna rose to 110 and Vikas Mitra to 3,391.
- In the second year of the scheme to release funds from the Central Corpus, assistance was provided for eight permanent projects in the Prants costing Rs. 11.18 lakhs.
- Of the 26 villages selected by the Parishad for their integrated development, work in eleven villages has been completed while work in the remaining 15 villages is at various stages of implementation.
- Number of our permanent projects rose to 1,567 and such projects continued to serve increasing number of citizens.
- Our major health centres continued to increasingly serve the society. Number of patients benefited by our Chandigarh Diagnostic Centre rose to 2.45 lakhs while our Kota Hospital (with super specialty facilities) provided treatment to 1.13 lakh patients.
- In connection with celebration of 150th Birth Anniversary of Swami Vivekanand, six publications on Swami Vivekanand were brought out. A record number of over 1.25 lakh copies of "Narendra to Vivekanand", the book specifically written for students, were distributed among the students all over the country.

I take this opportunity to thank all colleagues who worked tirelessly at the branch, state, zone and central levels for their cooperation in strengthening the organization in service of the Nation. In all humility, I present this report to the worthy members of the National Conference for approval.

ANNUAL REPORT: 2012-13

150TH BIRTH ANNIVERSARY OF SWAMI VIVEKANAND CELEBRATIONS

- 1.1 The year 2012-13 is the Golden Jubilee Year of Bharat Vikas Parishad. It is a happy coincidence that the 150th Birth Anniversary of Swami Vivekanand Celebrations also falls in this year. In fact it was on the birth centenary of Swami Vivekanand i.e. on 12th January, 1963, that the Citizens Council, set up by leading industrialists and social reformers like late Lala Hans Raj and Dr. Suraj Prakash, was renamed as Bharat Vikas Parishad. Parishad is thus motivated and guided by the ideals and teachings of Swami Vivekananda. Bharat Vikas Parishad, therefore, dedicated the year 2012-13 to the celebration of 150th Birth Anniversary of Swami Vivekanand.
- 1.2 Beginning with taking out of Prabhat Pheris, Shobha Yatras, and forming human chains, programmes included seminars, meetings and various functions dedicated to Swami Vivekanand. Competitions among children on the teachings of Swami Vivekanand were also organised. Over 100 statues of Swami Vivekanand were erected in various states of India. Parishad published books and pamphlets on the life and teachings of Swami Vivekanand. Parishad's book on "Bharat Ko Jano" included over 100 questions and answers on Swami Vivekanand and the quiz programme under "Bharat Ko Jano" Competition had a special round to test the awareness of students about Swami Vivekanand. Special issue of Parishad's periodical "Gyan Prabha" was brought out.
- 1.3 As part of Swami Vivekanand 150th Jayanti Celebrations, National level Elocution and Essay Writing Competitions were held on the 26th and 27th January, 2013 at Vivekananda Kendra, Kanya Kumari. The programme was sponsored by Andhra Pradesh West and Tamil Nadu Prant provided assistance.
- 1.4 Thirteen students selected at Prant level competitions participated in the National level elocution and essay writing competition. Prof S.P. Tiwari, National Working President and Shri S.K. Wadhwa, National Secretary General attended the programme. Shri A. Bala Krishnan, Vice President Vivekananda Kendra, was the chief guest.
- 1.5 The topic of the elocution competition was "India in the Vision of Swami Vivekananda". The participants had a choice of English or Hindi language. Top five winners in elocution competition and in one Essay Writing Competition were honoured with prizes.

ORGANISATION & FINANCE

Newly Elected National Office Bearers

- 2.1 Newly elected National Office Bearers of Bharat Vikas Parishad took oath of their office for a two year term in April, 2012 - Justice Vishnu Sadashiv Kokje, National President; Prof. Satya Prakash Tiwari, National Working President; Shri Surinder Kumar Wadhwa, National Secretary General and Dr. Kanhaiya Lal Gupta, National Finance Secretary.

Meetings at National Level

- 2.2 Following National level meetings / workshops were held during the year 2012-13:

National Meetings

- i. **National Governing Board (Rashtriya Karyakari Mandal)** held its meeting at Guwahati (Assam) on the 2nd and 3rd February, 2013. 185 delegates from all over the country attended. Gandhian philosopher, Padmashri Natwar Bhai Thakkar was the Chief Guest. An important decision taken was to raise the Central Share from Rs. 150/- to Rs.200/- w.e.f. April 2013. Further, it was also decided to continue the 150th birth anniversary celebrations of Swami Vivekanand till January 2014.
- ii. **National Office Bearers (Rashtriya Padhadhikari)** meeting was held on the 18th and 19th August, 2012 at Moradabad.
- iii. **Apex Body (Sheersh Mandal)** met on the 17th June, 2012 at Delhi.

National Workshops

- iv. Workshop of **National Executive and Zonal Executive** was held at Delhi on the 21st April, 2012
- v. Workshop of all newly elected / nominated **Prantiya Office Bearers** i.e. Presidents, Secretaries & Treasurers and Presidents & Secretaries of Trusts of Categories-A & Secretary of Category-B was held at Delhi on the 22nd April, 2012
- vi. Second all India Workshop for **Mahila Karya Kartas** was held at Faridabad, Haryana (7th October, 2012)

- 3.1 During 2012-13, Zonal Conferences were held at following nine locations to cover all the zones:

These conferences were well organised and attended. Central leadership provided guidance at the conferences.

Zones, Prants & Branches

- 4.1 At present there are 17 Zones and 59 Prants. Parishad's organisational growth during its journey so far, particularly during the last five years, is shown below:

- 4.2 It will be seen that during the year 2012-13, membership rose by 5.33% over the previous year. A comparative statement showing number of branches and membership in various Prants as on 31.03.2012 and 31.03.2013 is at **Annexure 1.**

Vikas Ratna and Vikas Mitra

- 5.1 Parishad has two schemes - “ **Vikas Ratna**” and “**Vikas Mitra**” to provide funds for urgent relief works as well as for providing funds for various service projects / programmes. While for “Vikas Mitra” the minimum contribution has been fixed at Rs. 11,000 (revised from Rs. 5,100 till the year 2011-12), a person can have the honour of being called **Vikas Ratna** if he/she pays a sum of Rs. One lakh by Cheque / Draft or Rupees One lakh fifty thousand in the shape of an advertisement to the Parishad. The investment of funds in FDRs, Bonds or Govt. Securities provides the much needed resources.
- 5.2 There has been encouraging response to the scheme. As on 31.03.2013, 110 Vikas Ratnas and 3,391 Vikas Mitras were enrolled. A statement showing geographical spread of the Vikas Ratnas & Vikas Mitras across various Prants is indicated in **Annexure 1.** List of Vikas Ratnas enrolled during 2012-13 is at **Annexure 2.**

Financial Assistance to Prants from the Corpus fund

- 6.1 Last year Parishad had initiated a scheme to provide financial assistance to Prants for permanent projects. In the second year eight projects were selected for which a total sum of Rs. 11.18 lakhs was released. List of such central assisted projects is at **Annexure at 3.**

Accounts for 2012-13

- 7.1 An audited Balance Sheet and Income & Expenditure Account of Bharat Vikas Parishad (Central Office) for the year 2012-13 are at **Annexures 4 & 5** respectively.

PROJECTS & PROGRAMMES

I. SANSKAR

- 8.1 The sanskar or educational programmes undertaken by the Parishad can be categorized as under:

- (i) Child & Youth Development
- (iii) Senior Citizens' Development

(i) Children & Youth Development

National Group Song Competition (N.G.S.C.)

- 9.1 Ever since the first National Group Song Competition of patriotic songs was held in 1967, such competitions have become an annual feature generating patriotic fervor. This is one of our oldest projects and has come to provide a measure of Bharat Vikas Parishad's popularity and identity among the student community, their family members and the teachers.
- 9.2 The competitions are held for students from class VIth to XIIth at Branch, Prant and All India levels. Teams selected at Branch level compete at Prant level and those selected at Prant level finally compete at All India level. In the competition at the national level, a team from each Prant sings one patriotic song each in Hindi from "Chetna Ke Swar" and a regional language and the best teams are awarded prizes.
- 9.3 At branch level, the participation of students during 2012-13 has been as under:

- 9.4 During the year 2012-13, Thirty-eighth All India National Group Song Competition was held at Haridwar (Uttarakhand) on the 24th-25th November 2012. While 42 state/prant teams took part in Hindi Patriotic Group Songs, 35 state/prant teams participated in Regional Patriotic Group Songs from all over the country. The number of participants in both the categories is

indicated below:

Swami Ramdev ji Maharaj and Acharya Balkrishan ji graced the occasion and applauded the efforts of the Bharat Vikas Parishad in inculcating love for the motherland among the students through chorus singing of patriotic songs and blessed the participants.

National Sanskrit Group Song Competition (NSGSC)

10.1 This programme was initially started as a competition for singing full text of Vandemataram to instill patriotic feelings among the children. During the year 2005-06, it was decided to rename the Vandemataram Competition as National Sanskrit Group Song Competition. Accordingly in this competition, the first song is to be a patriotic song in Sanskrit, from among the songs prescribed by the Parishad in "Rashtiya Geetika", and the second is a folk song of any state. The competition is conducted at Branch, Prant and National levels.

10.2 At branch level, the participation of students during 2012-13 has been as under:

- No. of branches organising the programme 484
- No. of schools who participated 2,184
- **No. of total participants 20,857**

10.3 Eighth All India National Sanskrit Group Song Competition 2012-13 was held on 12th-13th January, 2013 at Ahmedabad (Gujarat) hosted by Gujarat Madhya Prant. Rajya Sabha member and famous T.V. artist Smt. Smruti Irani was the Chief Guest.

10.4 Total 36 teams from different prants from all over India participated in the event. The winners in Sanskrit Group Song Competition were as follows:

Karnataka (South) stood first, second rank was shared by Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu; Andhra Pradesh (East) and Madhya Pradesh (West) were judged 3rd and 4th respectively.

10.5 In the Regional Folk Song Competition the winners' ranking was declared as under:

- (1) Maharashtra-Coastal, (2) Punjab (South), (3) Karnataka (South) and (4) Haryana (West).

Bharat Ko Jano

- 11.1 “Bharat Ko Jano” is a quiz programme for the school children to increase their awareness about the distinctive features of our country and culture. Since the year 2001-02, this competition is being held at branch, prant and national levels. This programme has generated great interest among the students.
- 11.2 In the first stage written test in General Knowledge is organised in each participating school for both junior (class 6 to 8) and senior (class 9 to 12) levels. Over one and half lakh “Bharat Ko Jano” books are distributed every year among the school students for this competition. Each Branch then conducts Quiz Competition among the students standing first, second and third in written test.
- 11.3 During 2012-13, the participation of children in Bhart Ko Jano Competition was as under:
- No. of branches organising the programme 763
 - No. of schools who participated 6,248
 - **No. of students participated in written test 6.04 lakhs**
- 11.4 The teams which stand first in both the groups are selected for the competition at the Prant level. Similarly, the teams selected at Prant level compete at the National level.
- 11.5 The **12th All India Bharat Ko Jano Competition** was held at Devas (Madhya Bharat West Prant) on the 29th and 30th December, 2012. As many as 87 teams (both Junior and Senior) from 46 Prants competed.
- 11.6 Smt. Sumitra Mahajan, former Central Minister and M.P. and Shri Sajan Kumar, M.P. graced the occasion.
- 11.7 Results of the Competition were as under:

Guru Vandan - Chhatra Abhinandan

- 12.1 Primary purpose of this programme is to strengthen in the minds of children the idea of respecting their parents and teachers, whose blessings will enable them to be successful in life. Under this programme, the representatives of branches visit selected schools, colleges or any other institutions in and around their areas to express thanks and gratitude to the teachers and congratulate the meritorious students. The most important aspect of the program that makes it a special one is that the students are encouraged to take the blessings of teachers and parents by touching their feet.
- 12.2 Such functions are organised during the period from 1st April to 15th October every year. Ever since the programme was adopted at the national level in 2001-02, there has been a good response to this programme in which lakhs of students and teachers participate every year.

12.3 During 2012-13, about **10 lakh students** participated in this programme as shown below:

- No. of branches organising the programme 619
- No. of schools who participated 3,878
- **No. of total participants 10.08 lakhs**

On the whole, 20,565 students and 10,644 teachers were honoured in various schools.

Bal and Yuva Shivr

13.1 During the year 2012-13, 170 branches organised **212 Sanskar Shivirs** wherein a total of 26,304 children and youth participated.

Guru Tegh Bahadur Balidan Diwas and Other Inspiring Events

14.1 Bharat Vikas Parishad has been observing the martyrdom day of Guru Teg Bahadur for many years. Public meetings, seminars and exhibitions are held to highlight the sacrifices of Sikh Gurus and pay respectful homage to the great patriot.

14.2 During 2012-13, **134 branches** organised a total of **249 functions** in various parts of the country in which **23,422** participants paid their homage to Guru Teg Bahadur.

14.3 In addition, 368 branches organised other 733 inspiring events in which **84,935** persons participated.

(ii) Senior Citizens' Development

Praudh Sanskar Yojana

15.1 Praudh Sanskar Yojana project aims to prepare retired persons to lead active, purposeful and dedicated social life.

15.2 During the year 2012-13, 31 branches organised **91 Sanskar Shivirs** wherein a total of 6,018 senior citizens participated

15.3 So far **19 All India Praudh Sanskar Shivirs** have been organised to motivate senior citizens to engage in social work where over 3,500 Praudhs have been trained so far. The participation in All India Praudh Sanskar Shivirs over the years has been as under:

- 15.4 The Nineteenth All India National Prard Sanskar shivir was organized at Jhansi on the 2nd and 3rd March, 2013. Host Prant was Bundelkhand. As many as **210 delegates** from 15 Prants attended the Shivir. Shri Pradeep Kumar Jain 'Aditya', Union Minister of State for Rural Development, was the Chief Guest in the inaugurated session. The concluding session was preside over by Swami Madhav Prapannacharya and Prof. Avinash Pandey, Vice Chancellor of Bundelkhand University.

II. SEWA

Viklang Sahayata Project (Assistance to Physically Challenged)

- 16.1 To help the handicapped persons to fully participate in social and national life of the country, Parishad has been implementing Viklang Sahayata and Punarvas Yojana. This is one of the important programmes of Bharat Vikas Parishad. Beginning with the establishment of its first Viklang Centre in Delhi in 1990, there are now **13 Viklang Sahayata Kendras** in various states, which provide artificial limbs free of cost to needy persons through their centres as well as by organising camps. **Two of our centres have won President of India Award and one FICCI Award.**
- 16.2 These centres provide free of cost artificial limbs, calipers, hearing aids, medicines, special shoes, and tri cycles. In addition, there are mobile workshops, which manufacture artificial limbs and provide service to the Viklang Camps organised by various Branches. Some of the centres have also taken up special programme for conducting operations for the polio victims.
- 16.3 During the year 2012-13, number of artificial limbs provided by the Viklang Kendras and branches is indicated below:

16.4 In addition, our branches **rehabilitated 1,066 handicapped persons** by providing them training in various vocations, securing employment or in obtaining railway passes etc. during the year.

Villages / Urban Slums Development

17.1 Each branch is encouraged to adopt either a village or a slum area for its overall development. During 2012-13, our branches took up **82 service projects in 38 villages**. The projects included health check-up camps, visit of mobile medical vans, vocational training centres, sanskar kendras and education of illiterate and neglected children. The centres also help in getting benefits of different schemes launched by the Government.

Integrated Development of Village through NRIs Assistance

18.1 Bharat Vikas Parishad, with financial assistance from Jindal Foundation Canada, has taken up Samagra Gram Vikas Project for all round development of villages in various parts of the country. So far work in **26 villages** has been taken up. Of these, work in the following eleven villages has been completed:

Vanvasi Sahayata Project (Tribal Development)

- 19.1 Bharat Vikas Parishad has been working for the welfare and uplift of the vanvasis of the country in general and North Eastern states in particular since 1992. Presently, Parishad has adopted a number of projects in the North Eastern states including Bongaigaon Hospital and number of hostels, Ekal Vidyalayas, libraries, vocational training centres, medical centres and solar lighting project.
- 19.2 During the year, financial assistance amounting to Rs. 52.50 lakhs was provided for projects in the tribal areas of the country. In addition, woolens and clothing worth Rs. 2.57 lakhs were made available. Thus the total assistance for Vanvasi Sahayata Project amounted Rs. 55.07 lakhs.

Environment

- 20.1 Bharat Vikas Parishad has launched "Green India Project" under which trees are planted by each of its branches. Similarly branches are to organize

distribution of sacred plants like Tulsi for homestead planting in urban colonies. During the year, our branches planted 1.18 lakh plants and distributed 0.55 lakh Tulsi plants – a total of 1.73 lakh plants.

Health (Other than Assistance to Physically Challenged)

- 21.1 Our branches regularly hold general health check-ups, blood donation camps and specialized medical camps e.g. dental care, eye care, T.B. camps, Hepatitis camps and camps for deaf etc. Facilities for registration of eye donation and surgery are also provided. Branches also regularly organise seminars on various aspects of health and conduct yoga camps. A number of hospitals and dispensaries set up the Parishad are also serving the society.

- 21.2 The number of beneficiaries in the health camps organised by the branches during the year were as under:

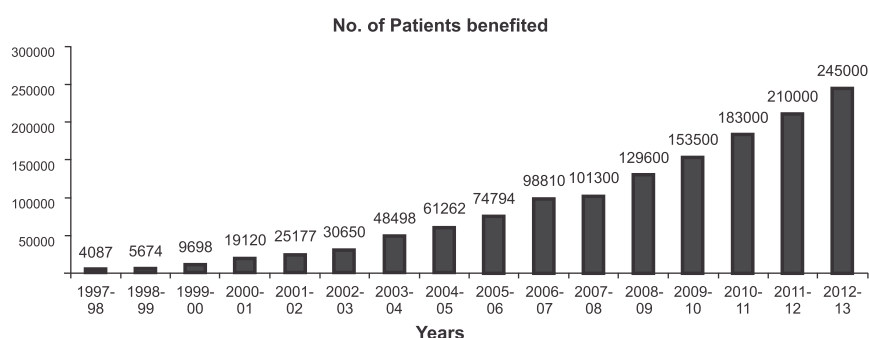
- No. of camps organised by branches **1,916**
- No. of beneficiaries **2.34 lakhs**

In addition, Parishad's members donated **20,631 units** of blood during the year.

- 21.3 Apart from organising health camps, Bharat Vikas Parishad has set up hospitals and diagnostics centres which provide advanced diagnostic and treatment facilities either free of cost or at highly subsidized rates in spirit of service to the citizens.

- 21.4 **BVP Charitable Diagnostic Centre, Chandigarh:** One of Parishad's pioneering diagnostics centre is at Chandigarh. It has highly advanced diagnostic and treatment facilities including Pathological Laboratory, X-ray Centre, Ultra Sound Centre, Cardiac Centre, Eye Care Centre and OPD. The OPD is presently providing consultation for Gynecology, General Medicine, Orthopedic, Skin, Paediatric, Gastrointestinal, Ayurvedic and Homeopathic consultation and prescription.

- 21.5 From 4,087 patients served during 1987-88 with limited facilities, the number of patients served rose to **2.45 lakhs** during 2012-13 as shown:



- 21.6 During 2012-13, following equipments worth of Rs 93.11 lakh were added to the Chandigarh Diagnostic Centre: (a) Automated Perimeter (for workup of

Glaucoma Patients), (b) Ambulance for Patiala, (c) Digital Dental OPG Machine, (d) Digital Mammography Machine, (e) 4-D Colour Doppler Machine, (f) Transformer 400 KVA, (g) Colour Doppler Vivid S6 (for Heart patients), (h) Phacco Surgery machine (for Cataract Eye Surgery), (i) Personal Warm Massager (Nuga Best) and (j) Endo Motor Xsmart Dentsply (for Dental Department)

- 21.7 **BVP Hospital & Research Centre, Kota (Rajasthan)** is a 220 bedded Super Specialty Hospital spread over 40,000 square feet with a staff of 300. Various departments functioning are: Dental, Orthopaedic, Pediatrics, Gyne, Male Surgery, General Physician, Eye, E.N.T, Cardiology, Physiotherapy, Dietician, Neuro Physician, etc. All the facilities of pathological diagnosis, Color Doppler, TMT, Angiography, Sonography, Digital X-Ray etc, are available in the Hospital. The facilities are available 24 hrs and emergency services are also provided.
- 21.8 In the Hospital, Super Specialty services of Cardiac Surgery, Advance Cath Lab, Dialysis, Advanced Stroke ICU, ICCU, PICU, and NICU, with all modern equipments, are also available. There are highly qualified and experienced medical consultants and dedicated staff. The Hospital is also organizing camps in the field of Eye, Orthopaedic etc. every year. Cardiac Surgery is done for poor people at especially cheaper rates.
- 21.9 During the year 2012, the hospital provided treatment to a total of **1.13 lakhs patients**.
- 21.10 **BVP Charitable Trust Hospital, Ludhiana (Punjab)** is running a hospital staffed with 53 personnel. In addition to helping 2,480 physically handicapped persons with artificial limbs and rehabilitating them during the year, the hospital also provided medical services to **37,687** patients through its various departments such as Physiotherapy, Homeopathy, Eyes, General Medicine, Gynaecology, Ayurvedic, Paediatric, Dental, Acupressure, Acupuncture, etc. Among its other services, it also conducted **204 polio operations** holding 13 camps.
- 21.11 **Delhi Bharat Vikas Foundation, Delhi:** Apart from providing artificial limbs and working for rehabilitation of physically challenged, Delhi Bharat Vikas Foundation is now also providing Eye Care, Homeopathy, Dental Care, Physiotherapy, X-Ray scan facilities. During the year, one C.T. scan machine was also installed. The number of beneficiaries in 2012-13 was **5,118**.

Samuhik Saral Vivah

- 22.1 Parishad has been organising Samuhik Saral Vivah of poor and needy young girls and boys as an important programme every year.
- 22.2 During the year 2012-13, Parishad helped in organising marriages of **1004 couples** belonging to weaker sections of the society.

Permanent Projects

- 23.1 There are now **1,567 permanent projects** run by various branches of Bharat Vikas Parishad whose activities are conducted on daily or weekly basis for the benefit of the society. These projects include Hospitals, Clinics, Physiotherapy Centres, Mobile Vans, Pathology Labs, Ultrasound Centres,

Blood Banks, Educational Institutions, Training Centres, Libraries, Reading Rooms, Yoga Training Centres, Sanskar Kendra, Senior Citizens Welfare Centres, Mukti Dhams & Legal Aid Cells etc.

23.2 The permanent projects can be broadly categorized in following areas:

III. SAMPARK (PUBLIC RELATIONS)

Sanskriti Saptah

24.1 This annual programme of Vikas Week / Sanskriti Saptah is conducted during the months of July to September. It enables the members to work together in numerous programmes and helps create awareness about the work of the Parishad among the citizens. The main emphasis under this programme is on Sampark and Sahyog.

24.2 During the year 2012-13, **456 branches** organised **3,666 programmes** during the Sanskriti Saptah. These programmes were attended by **1.57 lakh citizens**.

Sthapana Diwas

25.1 On Parishad's Foundation Day branches organise functions to celebrate the event in order to spread its message among the citizens. During 2012-13, **488 branches** organised such functions.

Mahila Sahbhagita

26.1 During the year, branches organised **216 programmes** especially for women which were attended by **11,821 participants**. At Prant level, **83 Sahbhagita Samellans** were organised which were attended by **2,602 delegates**.

Seminars

27.1 Parishad's branches hold seminars on contemporary subjects of national interest and welfare of humanity in institutions of higher education to reinforce Bhartiya Sanskriti and Sanskars among the youth. During the year, **303 branches** organised seminars in which **27,752** persons participated.

Workshops

28.1 During the year, **177 workshops** were organised at Branch level while **167 workshops** were held at Prant level which were attended by **5,930 and 6,699 members** respectively.

Publications

29.1 Bharat Vikas Parishad is regularly bringing out its bilingual monthly journal "Niti" (circulation: 53,000 copies) in Hindi and English. Parishad is also

publishing quarterly magazine “Gyan Prabha” to supplement “Niti” with thought provoking articles. This magazine fulfills the need to provide avenue for greater coverage of various issues which could not be accommodated in Niti due to space constraints.

29.2 In connection with celebration of 150th Birth Anniversary of Swami Vivekanand during the year, six publications on Swami Vivekanand were brought out which were widely distributed. It is noteworthy that, through an imaginative scheme of bunching BKJ books with “Narendra to Vivekanand”, the book specifically written for students, a record number of over **1.25 lakh books** (Hindi and English editions) were distributed among the students throughout the country. In addition, 25,000 copies of other literature on the life of Swami Vivekanand were distributed. As mentioned earlier, special issue of “Gyan Prabha” on Swami Vivekanand was also released during the year.

29.3 Literature on Bharat Vikas Parishad, its projects and activities is being continuously revised and updated. A complete list of publications is at **Annexure-6**.

29.4 In addition, Branches and Prants brought out **91 and 60** publications respectively at their levels.

Media Sampark

30.1 During the year Prants organized **300 press conferences** to brief the media about the activities of the Parishad.

Parishad’s Website & Social Media

31.1 Parishad’s website (www.bvpindia.com) continued to add new features to be a useful tool kit for conducting our programmes as well as an effective vehicle to disseminate information about the activities of the Bharat Vikas Parishad among the internet users. Among the new additions to the website are (a) state-wise contact details of the elected Presidents, Secretaries and Treasurers of all the Branches and (b) particulars of financial assistance to states for the permanent projects. The website is now being accessed by lakhs of internet users from 165 countries around the world.

31.2 Parishad is also using social media such as Facebook for spreading awareness about its work and to reach out to the younger generation. Now many Prants and Branches also have their presence on the Facebook.

Remembering Those Who Are No More

32 Parishad places on record the valuable contribution of two of our stalwarts - Shri Govind Narain, ICS (Retd) and Shri Kedar Nath Sahni who passed away during the year. Shri Govind Narain guided us as our Patron while Shri Sahni was one of the Founder Members of Bharat Vikas Parishad.
