FROM THE NATIONAL SECRETARY GENERAL

AN OVERVIEW

It is my great privilege to present the Annual Report of Bharat Vikas Parishad on completion of 50 years of its glorious service to the Nation. It was a satisfying and engaging year of activities for our members working among the fellow citizens throughout the country. The main highlights of the work during year were as under:

- Parishad celebrated its Golden Jubilee all over the country by organizing various functions at National, Prant and Branch levels. The celebrations began with a curtain raiser function at New Delhi in July, 2013 and continued throughout the year by holding seminars, meetings, Golden Jubilee National Conference, elocution competition and other functions.
- Meetings of the national bodies and workshops in respect of various faculties were productively organised during the year.
- All India level programmes of our projects – National Group Song Competition, National Sanskrit Group Song Competition, Bharat Ko Jano, etc. - were successfully held.
- Prants and Branches continued to organize various sanskar, sewa and sampark projects and involve members and citizens of the country.
- Membership of the Parishad rose to 53,000 families.
- Number of Vikas Ratna rose to 126 and Vikas Mitra to 3,416.
- In the third year of the scheme to release funds from the Central Corpus, total assistance of Rs. 28.53 lakhs was provided to as many as 16 projects for strengthening their infrastructure and capabilities.
- Under the integrated village development programme undertaken by Parishad for all round transformation of villages, work in 14 villages was completed till date, while work in another 16 villages was at various stages of completion.
- Number of our permanent projects rose to 1,460 and these continued to serve greater number of citizens needing help and support. For example, the number of patients annually benefited by our major health centres such as Chandigarh Diagnostic Centre rose to 3.05 lakhs and by Kota Hospital (having super specialty facilities) to 1.60 lakhs.
- On the occasion of celebration of Parishad's Golden Jubilee, special issues of Niti and Gyan Prabha as well as voluminous multi-coloured BVP Golden Jubilee Souvenir were brought out.

- In the National Governing Board meeting held during the year, four National Office Bearers for the years 2014-16 were unanimously elected.

I take this opportunity to thank all colleagues who tirelessly worked at the branch, state, zone and central levels for their cooperation in strengthening the organization in service of the Nation. In all humility, I present this report to the worthy members of the National Council for approval.

ANNUAL REPORT: 2013-14

A. GOLDEN JUBILEE CELEBRATIONS

- 1.1 Parishad celebrated its Golden Jubilee by holding yearlong programmes all over the country. At national level, a curtain raiser function was held on 7th July, 2013 at India International Centre, New Delhi where founder members, ex-elected National Office Bearers as well as distinguished personalities, who had contributed for the growth of BVP, were felicitated. The programme was presided over by Honb'le Justice Ramesh Chand Lahoti, Ex. Chief Justice of India, who commended Bharat Vikas Parishad for its welfare programmes for the people. Shri Jagmohan, former Governor of Jammu & Kashmir, was the chief guest. The function was hosted by Delhi North Prant.
- 1.2 A number of seminars, meetings and other functions were held by the branches and Prants throughout the year. At the Golden Jubilee functions held at Hyderabad, Dr. K. Rosaiah, Governor, Tamilnadu graced the function. In the Elocution Competition held there, 22 students from seven Prants participated and the best three were awarded by the Governor.
- 1.3 Parishad's Golden Jubilee National Conference was held at Varanasi in December, 2013. Mega special issues of Niti and Gyan Prabha were brought out. The yearlong programme was capped by release of voluminous multi-coloured BVP Golden Jubilee Souvenir at the National Governing Board meeting held in February, 2014. An important feature of the Souvenir was that it had contributions from almost all the Prants and articles on all Projects by concerned office bearers.

Golden Jubilee National Conference: December 2013

- 1.4 BVP Golden Jubilee National Conference held at Varanasi was a memorable one. Delegates from all over the country represented a mini-India.
- 1.5 In the first session of the conference, Shri S.K. Wadhwa, National Secretary General, presented his report on various activities of the Parishad organized during the year 2012-13 which was approved by the delegates. Dr. Murlu Manohar Joshi, M.P. and Chairman of the Public Accounts Committee was the chief guest. In his address he exhorted the delegates to increase their area of work. He emphasized that the country is known by the strength of its citizens which the Parishad is trying to develop. He further stated that India considered the whole country as a family while the west considered the world only as a market.
- 1.6 In the second session, celebrated writer Dr. Narender Kohli spoke about Swami Vivekanand's contribution in presenting India to the West and his emphasis on removing poverty and illiteracy. In the special session for women, Smt. Smriti

Irani called upon the women to fully utilize the rights which are now available to them.

- 1.7 In the first session of the second day of the conference, Swami Yatindra graced the National Conference as the chief guest. He spoke about the importance of sewa. In the second session, Dr. Bajrang Lal Gupta, prominent social worker, was the Chief Guest and National Working President Prof. Satya Prakash Tiwari presided. Dr. Gupta emphasized the importance of organization and sampark.
- 1.8 In the concluding session, Parishad's Chief Patron Swami Satymitranand Giri Ji blessed the delegates. In his presidential address National President Justice Vishnu Sadashiv Kokje stated that Parishad will give greater push to its sanskar activities among the youth.

2. Meetings and Workshops at National Level

- 2.1 Following National level meetings / workshops were held during the year 2013-14:

- v. **Zonal Executive Committee (Shetriya Karyakarni)** members meeting was held at Delhi on the 2nd June, 2013
- vi. **Apex Body (Sheerssh Mandal)** had its meetings on 7th April, 2013 and 16th December, 2013 at Delhi.

- iii. National Workshop **Organisational Matters** was held at Delhi (18th August, 2013)
- iv. Meeting-cum-workshop of National, Zonal & Prantiya Office Bearers of **Sewa and Sampark** was held at Delhi (23rd June, 2013)
- v. Meeting-cum-workshop of National, Zonal & Prantiya Office Bearers of **Sanskar Karya** was held at Delhi (1st June, 2013)

- vi. National Workshop of elected **Prantiya Office Bearers** was held at Delhi (28th April, 2013)

3. Meeting of the National Governing Board: February, 2014

- 3.1 National Governing Board (NGB) held its meeting on 15th & 16th February 2014 at Noida (U.P.). A total of 192 members attended the meeting. The meeting was presided over by the National President, Justice V.S. Kokje. Shri Ashok Pradhan, Ex-Central Minister, graced the occasion as the Chief Guest. Shri V. Bhagaiah spoke in the concluding session.

Apart from other deliberations, Golden Jubilee Souvenir published on the eve of completion of 50 years of Bharat Vikas Parishad was released by Dr. K.L. Gupta. Another Souvenir "Swarnim Abhyudaya" published by Western U.P. Prant was also released on this occasion.

- 3.2 The National Governing Board unanimously elected four National Office Bearers for the years 2014-16:

- (a) National President Shri Sitaram Pareek (Mumbai-Maharashtra)
(b) National Working President Shri S.K. Wadhwa (Delhi)
(c) National Secretary General Dr. K.L. Gupta (Aligarh-U.P.)
(d) National Finance Secretary Shri S.N. Panda (Bhubneshwar- Orissa)

Nomination of Shri Suresh Chandra Gupta as National Organizing Secretary for the year 2014-16 was also approved.

4. Zones, Prants & Branches

- 4.1 As on March 2014 there were 17 Zones and 59 Prants. Over the years there has been steady increase in the number of branches and membership of the Parishad. Based on Central Share actually received in the Central Office, the organisational growth of the Parishad is presented below:

- 4.2 It will be seen that the year 2013-14 was year of consolidation as increase in membership over the previous year was negligible. A statement showing number of branches and membership in various Prants as on 31.03.2013 and 31.03.2014 is at **Annexure 1**.

5. Districts with Parishad's Branches

- 5.1 The extent of expansion of Parishad's work in districts in different regions of the

country is shown below:

It will be seen from the above table that while Parishad's work in the Northern Region of the country extends to 65 percent of the districts, on the whole our branches are present only in 44 percent of the districts of the country. Further, 55 percent of our branches (643 out of total 1166 branches) operate in Northern Region alone.

6. Permanent Corpus Fund

- 6.1 Parishad had launched two schemes viz. "**Vikas Ratna**" and "**Vikas Mitra**" to generate funds for urgent relief works as well as for funding various service projects / programmes, The minimum contributions under the schemes are Rs. one lakh and Rs. 11,000 (revised from Rs. 5,100 till the year 2011-12) respectively. The investment of funds in FDRs, Bonds or Govt. Securities provides the much needed resources.
- 6.2 There has been encouraging response to the scheme. As on 31.03.2014, **126 Vikas Ratnas** and **3,416 Vikas Mitras** were enrolled. A statement showing geographical spread of the Vikas Mitras across various Prants is indicated in **Annexure 1**. List of Bharat Vikas Ratnas enrolled during 2013-14 is at **Annexure 2**.

7. Financial Assistance to Prants

- 7.1 A scheme to provide financial assistance to Prants out of central office corpus fund for permanent projects was launched in the year 2011-12. In the third year of this scheme, assistance totaling Rs.28.53 lakh was provided to as many as 16 projects for improving their infrastructure. List of such central assisted projects is at **Annexure 3**.
- ## 8. Accounts for 2013-14
- 8.1 An audited Balance Sheet and Income & Expenditure Account of Bharat Vikas Parishad (Central Office) for the year 2013-14 are at **Annexures 4 & 5** respectively.

C. PROJECTS & PROGRAMMES

I. SANSKAR

9. National Group Song Competition (N.G.S.C.)

- 9.1 With a view to generate patriotic fervor among the children, Parishad has been

organizing chorus singing among the students studying both in Government and Public schools. This is one of our oldest projects. Students and teachers all over the country eagerly look forward to participation in such competitions.

9.2 The competitions are held for students from class VIth to XIIth at Branch, Prant and All India levels. Teams selected at Branch level compete at Prant level and those selected at Prant level finally compete at All India level. In the competition at the national level, a team from each Prant sings one patriotic song in Hindi from the book “Chetna Ke Swar” and a song in regional language and the best teams are awarded prizes. The first all India National Group Song Competition of patriotic songs was held in 1967.

9.3 At branch level, the participation of students during 2013-14 has been as under:

- No. of branches organising the programme 611
- No. of schools who participated 4,546
- **No. total of participants 36,642**

9.4 The 39th All India National Group Song Competition was held at Ludhiana (Punjab North) on the 16th-17th November 2013. Record number of 45 Prants participated. While all the 45 prant teams took part in Hindi Patriotic Group Songs, 31 prant teams participated in Regional Patriotic Group Songs from all over the country.

9.5 The programme was inaugurated by Sardar Prakash Singh Badal, Chief Minister of Punjab. Prominent amongst those who were present on the occasion included Industrialists Shri Rajiv Nanachal, Punjab Public Works Minister Shri Sharanjit Singh Dhillon and Advisor to the Chief Minister Mahesh Inder Singh Grewal.

9.6 While addressing the mammoth gathering Sardar Parkash Singh Badal impressed upon the need to establish a value based society. He called upon the eminent scholars and academicians attached with the non-political social organizations to further intensify their efforts to inculcate the spirit of nationalism and communal harmony amongst our young. He appreciated the Parishad's work among the youth for preserving our rich cultural heritage.

9.7 Following teams won the first place in Hindi and Regional songs:

9.8 In Hindi Song competition, the Second, Third, and Fourth places were won by Punjab North, Delhi South and Uttarakhand West Prants respectively. Similarly, in Regional Song competition, the Second, Third, and Fourth places were won Punjab South, Tamil Nadu & Pondicherry and Gujarat Central Prants respectively.

10. National Sanskrit Group Song Competition (NSGSC)

10.1 In this competition, the first song is to be a patriotic song in Sanskrit, from among the songs prescribed by the Parishad in the book “Rashtriya Geetika”, and the second is a folk song of any state. The competition is conducted at Branch, State

and National levels all over the country for students studying both in Government and Public schools.

- 10.2 At branch level, the participation of students during 2013-14 has been as under:
- No. of branches organising the programme 471
 - No. of schools who participated 2,358
 - **No. of total participants 18,884**
- 10.3 Ninth All India National Sanskrit Group Song Competition 2013-14 was held on 1st December, 2013 at Patiala The event was hosted by Punjab East Prant.
- 10.4 On 30th November, a Cultural Eve was organized. It was presided by Shri S.P. Tiwari, National Working President and was inaugurated by Shri Madan Mohan Mittal, Cabinet Minister, Govt. of Punjab. Shri Mittal highly appreciated the projects taken up by Parishad. S. Hardyal Singh Mann, SSP Patiala and Shri Ranjan Gupta Member, Disciplinary Committee of Punjab & Haryana Bar Council gave blessings to the participants.
- 10.5 The opening session was presided over by National President Justice (retired) V.S. Kokje. The chief guest was S. Jaspal Singh, Vice-Chancellor Punjabi University, Patiala. Shri Amarinder Singh Bajaj, Mayor Patiala inaugurated Folk Song Competition at Kala Bhawan. He was greatly impressed by the folk performances of participants from different states. A souvenir 'Swarnim 50 Varsh' was released on this occasion.
- 10.6 Forty one teams participated in National Sanskrit Group Song Competition - both in Sanskrit Song and Folk Song competitions. Following teams won the first place in Sanskrit and Folk songs:

- 10.7 In Sanskrit Song competition, the Second, Third, and Fourth places were won by Haryana South, Tamilnadu & Pondicherry, and Gujarat Central Prants respectively. Similarly, in Folk Song competition, the Second, Third, and Fourth places were won by Assam, Punjab North and Rajasthan West Prants respectively.

Bharat Ko Jano

- 11.1 "Bharat Ko Jano" is a quiz programme for the school children to increase their awareness about the distinctive features of our country and culture. Since the year 2001-02, this competition is being held at branch, prant and national levels. This programme has generated great interest among the students.
- 11.2 In the first stage written test in General Knowledge is organised in each participating school for both junior (class 6 to 8) and senior (class 9 to 12) levels. Over one lakh Bharat Ko Jano books are distributed every year among the school students for this competition. Each Branch then conducts Quiz Competition among the students standing first, second and third in written test. The teams which stand first in both the groups are selected for the competition at the Prant level. Similarly, the teams selected at Prant level compete at National level.

11.3 During 2013-14, the participation of children in Bharat Ko Jano Competition was as under:

- No. of branches organising the programme 748
- No. of schools who participated 6,447
- **No. of students participated in written test 7.76 lakh**

11.4 The 13th **All India Bharat Ko Jano Competition** was held at Bhilwara (Rajasthan Central) on the 28th-29th December, 2013. As many as 94 teams (both Junior and Senior) from 50 Prants competed.

11.5 Swami Vidyanand Saraswati of Valsad (Gujarat) was the Chief Guest at the inaugural function. He stated that the real progress consisted in spiritual and not material advancement. He lauded the efforts of the Bharat Vikas Parishad for working towards developing India into a superpower of the world.

11.6 Prant-wise results of the Competition were as under:

Junior Category:

First: Haryana West; **Second:** Braj Pradesh; and **Third:** Delhi East

Senior Category:

First: Maharashtra-2; **Second:** Punjab North; and **Third:** Himachal Pradesh East

Guru Vandan - Chhatra Abhinandan

12.1 The primary purpose of this programme is to strengthen in the minds of children their respect for their parents and teachers, whose blessings will enable them to be successful in life. Under this programme, the representatives of Bharat Vikas Parishad visit a number of schools in their areas to express thanks and gratitude to the teachers and congratulate the meritorious students.

12.2 Parishad adopted this programme from the year 2001-02. The period from 1st April to 15th October is earmarked for organizing such functions. There has been a good response to this programme in which lakhs of students and teachers participate every year.

12.3 During the year, over 12 lakh students participated in this programme as shown below:

- No. of branches organising the programme 720
- No. of schools who participated 4,261
- **No. of total participants 12.31 lakhs**

On the whole, **19,917** students and **15,990** teachers were honoured in various schools.

Guru Tegh Bahadur Balidan Diwas and Other Inspiring Events

13.1 Bharat Vikas Parishad has been observing the martyrdom day of Guru Teg Bahadur for many years. Public meetings, seminars and exhibitions are held to highlight the sacrifices of Sikh Gurus and pay respectful homage to the great patriot.

13.2 During 2013-14, **164 branches** all over the country organised programmes to pay homage to Guru Teg Bahadur in which a total of **24,181** persons participated.

13.3 In addition, **206 branches** organised **other inspiring events** throughout the year which had over **70,000** participants.

Bal, Yuva, Mahila and Parivar Sanskar Shivirs

- 14.1 During the year 2013-14, 149 branches organised **Bal/Yuva** Shivirs in which total participation was 15,804. In addition, 115 branches organised **Mahila Sanskar Shivirs** in which 15,865 women participated. Eighty branches held **Parivar Sanskar Shivirs** where the participation was 16,518.

Praudh Sanskar Yojana

- 15.1 Parishad took up this project in the year in 1995. The aim of Praudh Sanskar project is to prepare retired persons to lead active, purposeful and dedicated social life.
- 15.2 During the year 2013-14, 22 branches organised **Sanskar Shivirs** wherein a total of **5,453 senior citizens** participated.
- 15.3 **Twentieth All India Praudh Sanskar Shivir** was held at Jammu (Jammu & Kashmir) on the 22nd and 23rd February, 2014. 370 delegates from different states of India attended the Shivir. Shri Kuldeep Khoda, IPS(Retd), Chief Vigilance Commissioner, J&K was the Chief Guest. Among others who graced the Shivir were Shri V.P. Sharma, Chairman Chamber of Commerce, Smt. Sunita Gupta, Chairperson, Heritage School, Dr. Jigar Mohammed, Dean, University of Jammu and Shri Raman Bhalla, Cabinet Minister, J&K.
- 15.4 Shivir's first session was devoted to discussing activities which can be taken up by the Praudhs; the second session was on organizing Praudh sanskar shivirs and the third session was devoted to the ways the elderly persons can keep themselves fit.

II. SEWA

16. Viklang Sahayata Project (Assistance to Physically Challenged)

- 16.1 Helping the handicapped persons and their rehabilitation is one of the important programmes of the Bharat Vikas Parishad which was taken up in 1990. There are now 13 Viklang Sahayata Kendras in various states serving the physically challenged. Two of our centres have won President of India Award and one FICCI Award. The programme aims to enable the handicapped persons to fully participate in social and national life of the country overcoming their disability.
- 16.2 Our centres provide free of cost artificial limbs, calipers, hearing aids, medicines, special shoes, and tri cycles. In addition, there are mobile workshops, which manufacture artificial limbs and provide service to the Viklang Camps organised by various Branches. Some of the centres have also taken up special programme for conducting operations for the polio victims.
- 16.3 During the year 2013-14, number of artificial limbs provided by the Viklang Kendras and branches is indicated below:

(a) By BVP branches at Viklang camps	12,823
(b) By Viklang Kendras at their own centres	5,880
(c) By Viklang Kendras at camps organized by organisations other than BVP	1,620

- 16.4 Our branches also rehabilitated 451 physically challenged by providing them training in various vocations, securing employment or in obtaining railway passes etc. during the year.

- 16.5 Our Viklang Sahayata Kendras have so far provided artificial limbs to over 2.18 lakhs physically challenged persons as detailed below:

Villages / Urban Slums Development

- 17.1 Branches are encouraged to adopt either a village or a slum area for its over-all development. During 2013-14, our branches took up 79 service projects in **49 adopted villages**. The projects included health check-up camps, visit of mobile medical vans, vocational training centres, sanskar kendras and education of illiterate and neglected children. The members also help the villagers in getting benefits of different schemes launched by the Government.

Integrated Development of Village through NRIs Assistance

- 18.1 Bharat Vikas Parishad, with financial assistance from Jindal Foundation Canada, has taken up Samagra Gram Vikas Project for all round development of villages in various parts of the country. The objective is to work for village development and improvement and in doing so to motivate villagers so that they can do improvement in their living conditions by themselves and be self-sustaining without too much dependence on others.
- 18.2 The programme targets to develop at least one model village in each state of India in a phased manner. Works in the following villages have so far been completed:
1. Khajjiar (H.P.)
 2. Dunera (Punjab)
 3. Sunder Nagar (U.P.)
 4. Ekaspur (A.P.)
 5. Mohabbatpur (Haryana)

- 18.3 Parishad has provided financial assistance amounted to Rs. 2.16 crores for completion of the above projects. This amount is exclusive of the contribution made by villagers by way funds and labour provided.
- 18.4 Presently our development works are going on in the following villages:

Parishad has so far provided funds amounting to Rs. 78 lakhs for implementation of projects in the above villages. Together with funds amounting to Rs. 2.16 crores already spent on completed projects, the total financial expenditure on Samagra Gram Vikas Project till now amounts to **Rs.2.94 crores.**

Vanvasi Sahayata Project (Tribal Development)

- 19.1 Since 1992, Bharat Vikas Parishad has been taking up programmes for the welfare and uplift of the vanvasis of the country in general and North Eastern states in particular. Presently, Parishad has adopted a number of projects in the North Eastern states including Bongaigaon Hospital and hostels, Ekal Vidyalayas, computer centres, archery centres, libraries, vocational training centres, weaving centres, medical centres and solar lights projects.

- 19.2 During the year, financial assistance amounting to Rs. 7.00 lakhs was provided by the Central Office for following projects in the tribal areas of the country:

In addition, expenditure amounting to Rs. 43.08 lakh was incurred by Prants on projects in their own tribal areas. Thus the total assistance for Vanvasi Sahayata Project amounted to **Rs. 50.08 lakh.**

Environment

- 20.1 Under this project, branches take up tree plantation, distribution of sacred plant e.g. Tulsi, and organise seminars on environment. During the year, our branches planted 58,831 plants and distributed 54,296 Tulsi plants – a total of **1.13 lakh plants.**

Health (other than assistance to Handicapped)

- 21.1 Regular general health check-ups, blood donation camps and specialized medical camps e.g. dental care, eye care, T.B. camps, Hepatitis camps and camps for deaf etc. are organized. Facilities for registration of eye donation and surgery are also provided. Branches also regularly organise seminars on various aspects of health and conduct yoga camps.
- 21.2 The number of beneficiaries in health camps organised by the branches during the year was as under:

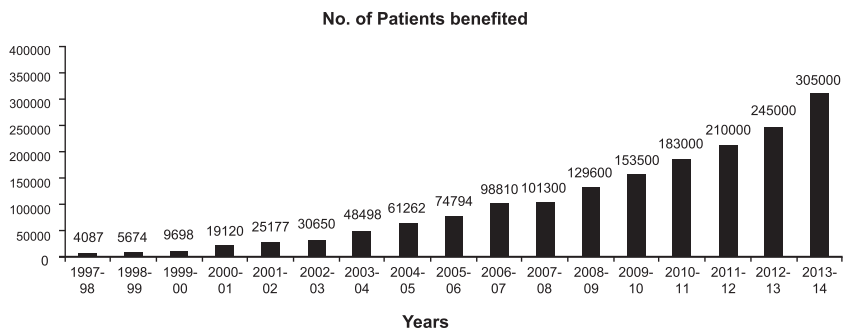
In addition, Parishad's members also donated **18,590 units of blood** during the year.

- 21.3 Apart from organising health camps, Bharat Vikas Parishad has set up hospitals and diagnostics centres which provide advanced diagnostic and treatment facilities either free of cost or at highly subsidized rates in spirit of service to the citizens.

- 21.4 **BVP Charitable Diagnostic Centre, Chandigarh:** Diagnostic Centre at Chandigarh has highly advanced diagnostic and treatment facilities under one roof. All types of Blood and Urine Tests, Digital X-ray, Digital Mammography, Digital OPG, Ultrasound, Echocardiography, TMT, ECG, Complete Dental treatment, all types of Eye problems, Gynae service, Ortho Service, Skin

Service, Physiotherapy, Rheumatology, Gastrology, Internal medicine and 16 Slice CT Scan are provided at no profit no loss basis.

- 21.5 The number of patients served rose to **3.05 lakhs** during 2013-14 as shown below:



- 21.6 **BVP Hospital & Research Centre, Kota (Rajasthan):** It is a Super Specialty 200 bedded hospital spread over 40,000 square feet with a staff of 275. Various departments functioning are Dental, Orthopaedic, Paediatric, Gynae, Male Surgery, General Physician, Eye, E.N.T, Cardiology, Physiotherapy, Dietician, Neuro Physician, etc. All the facilities of Pathological diagnosis, Color Doppler, TMT, Angiography, Sonography, Digital X-Ray etc, are available in the Hospital. The facilities are available 24 hrs and emergency services are also provided.
- 21.7 Super Specialty services of Cardiac Surgery, Advance Cath Lab, Dialysis, Advanced Stroke ICU, ICCU, PICU, and NICU, with all modern equipments, are also available. There are highly qualified and experienced medical consultants and dedicated staff. Cardiac Surgery is done for poor patients at especially cheaper rates.
- 21.8 During the year, the hospital provided treatment to a total of **1.60 lakhs** patients. In addition **15,448** patients were admitted in hospital for treatment in various departments.
- 21.9 The hospital is also providing mobile services and organizing camps in the fields of Eye, ENT etc. Over the years, **mobile medical services** have benefitted **3.13 lakh patients**, **7,500 patients** through **150 ENT camps**, and **46,450 patients** through **243 eye camps**.
- 21.10 **BVP Charitable Trust Hospital, Ludhiana Punjab:** In addition to helping the physically handicapped persons with artificial limbs and rehabilitating them, the Trust Hospital also provided services in its polyclinic. During the year, through its various departments such as Physiotherapy, Homeopathy, Eyes, Gen. Medicine, Gynecology, Ayurveda, Paediatric, Dental, Acupressure, Acupuncture, etc., **26,878 patients** benefited. In addition, hospital undertook **operations on 81 patients**.
- 21.11 **BVP Punarvas Kendra & Sanjay Anand Viklang Hospital & Research Centre, Patna:** It is a Super Specialty Centre for prosthetic and orthotics as well as for corrective and innovative surgery. The centre also has an Orthopedically Handicapped Surgery Unit and Physiotherapy Centre with state-of-the-art facilities. During 2013-14, apart from providing artificial limbs to 1,940 physically

challenged persons, the centre conducted **polio and corrective surgery on 183 patients.**

- 21.12 **Generic Medicine Facilities:** Our BVP Trust in Hyderabad has started a network of **11** "Bharat Vikas Sanjeevani Generic Medical Shops" which are serving the public in Hyderabad and Secunderabad. Here more than 350 medicines are sold at very low rates compared to other commercial medical shops. More than 20,000 people benefited from buying generic medicines.

Samuhik Saral Vivah

- 22.1 Parishad has been organising Samuhik Saral Vivah of poor and needy young girls and boys as an important programme every year.
- 22.2 During the year 2013-14, Parishad helped in organising marriages of **474 couples** belonging to weaker sections of the society.

23. Relief Work

In June 2013, when cloudburst caused devastating floods and landslides in Uttrakhand, our branches rushed to help the suffering brethren by providing medicines, food, clothing and shelter to the victims of the floods by organizing relief camps. Parishad is now taking up a number of permanent projects in the state costing over Rupees one crore. Construction of school building cum community center/ shelter for pilgrims and affected persons at Gaucher in Uttrakhand is in progress.

Permanent Projects

- 24.1 There are now **1,460 permanent projects** run by various branches of Bharat Vikas Parishad whose activities are conducted on daily or weekly basis for the benefit of the society. These projects include Hospitals, Clinics, Physiotherapy Centres, Mobile Vans, Pathology Labs, Ultrasound Centres, Blood Banks, Educational Institutions, Training Centres, Libraries, Reading Rooms, Yoga Training Centres, Sanskar Kendra, Senior Citizens Welfare Centres, Mukti Dhams & Legal Aid Cells etc.
- 24.2 The permanent projects can be broadly categorized in following areas:

III. SAMPARK (PUBLIC RELATIONS)

Sanskriti Saptah

- 25.1 Every year Parishad's branches organise Sanskriti Saptah during the months of July to September. The aim of this week long celebrations is to create awareness about the work of the Parishad among the citizens. The emphasis under this programme is on Sampark and Sahyog. During the year 2013-14, **521 branches** organised **3,918 programmes** during the Sanskriti Saptah.

Sthapana Diwas

- 26.1 Parishad's Foundation Day is celebrated by the branches by organizing functions to spread its message among the citizens. During 2013-14, **578 branches** organised such functions in which a total of **39,974 persons** participated.

Mahila Sahbhagita

- 27.1 During the year, branches organised **178 programmes** especially for the women which were attended by **11,015 participants**.

Seminars

- 28.1 Bharat Vikas Parishad holds seminars on contemporary subjects of national interest and welfare of humanity in institutions of higher education to reinforce Bhartiya Sanskriti and Sanskars among the youth. During the year, **368 seminars** were organized in which **48,706 persons participated**.

Workshops

- 29.1 During the year, Prants and branches organized **85** and **179 workshops** in which **3,729** and **14,128 members** respectively participated.

Publications

- 30.1 Parishad's bilingual monthly journal "Niti" (in Hindi and English) is brought out regularly. During the year its circulation rose to 53,000 copies. Parishad is also publishing half-yearly magazine "Gyan Prabha" to supplement "Niti" with thought provoking articles. Each issue has a central theme on which a number of authors contribute. As mentioned earlier, in connection with Golden Jubilee Celebrations mega special issues of Niti and Gyan Prabha as well as multi-coloured BVP Golden Jubilee Souvenir were also brought out during the year.
- 30.2 Parishad's Publications Department continued to bring out revised and updated literature on various projects and activities of Bharat Vikas Parishad. A complete list of publications is at **Annexure 6**.
- 30.3 In addition, Branches and Prants brought out **38** and **58 publications** respectively.

Media Sampark

- 31.1 During the year, Prants organized **135 press conferences** to brief the media about the activities of the Parishad.

Parishad's Website & Social Media

- 32.1 Parishad's website (www.bvpindia.com), which is maintained in-house, is now a useful tool kit for conducting our programmes as well as an effective vehicle to disseminate information about the activities of the Bharat Vikas Parishad. It continued to add newer features. Among the additions to the website are (a) all songs from "Chetna Ke Swar" (Hindi songs) and (b) "Rashtriya Geetika" (Sanskrit songs) which are prescribed for competitions among the students all over the country. This step is expected to result in reduced demand for hard copies.
- 32.2 The website is now being accessed by lakhs of internet users from **173 countries** around the world.
- 32.3 Parishad is also maintaining its presence on the Facebook providing latest news about the activities of the Parishad. The Central Office as well as Prants and Branches are equally active on the Facebook to reach out to the younger generation.
